1. Thank you for participating
2. Some like to use their own Bibles, some like to use a device—either is fine. If you would like to grab your Bible, feel free to take the time now to do so.
3. Prayer to open, there will also be a closing prayer. If anyone wants to include any prayer requests tonight, we will include them as we close in prayer...you can start thinking now if you would like to share any prayer requests at the end.
4. Prayer: “Lord God of the Church, you are awesome in power, greatest in wisdom, and tremendous in love. You are the One who has stomped our sins beyond recognition and given every ounce of our guilt a heave into the depths of the sea. Bless our time in the Word and strengthen us for service in your Kingdom, Lord. You care for us and treasure us; you bless us and love us; you prepare us for works of service to your glory and for the praise of your Name. Psalm 31:24: **“Be strong and take heart, all you who hope in the LORD.”**

Thought questions:

- a. What might be some ways that we display hope in the LORD?
- b. In your mind, what does it mean to “take heart?”
- c. Why is hope important? (beyond “Gone With The Wind” or “Lord Of The Rings,” in N.T. usually connected to the Lord or heaven.)

1 Corinthians 16: 13 **“Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong.”**

Thought questions:

- a. What are some ways that we can be on our guard?
- b. What is the difference between being courageous and being strong?
- c. Ask yourself the questions, “am I strong?” “Am I courageous?” How does one become more strong or courageous?

Luke 12:6-7: **“Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God. Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don’t be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.”**

Thought questions:

- a. Why might a person begin to doubt if God cares about them?
- b. In a lesson such as this, Jesus shows himself to be a master teacher. In what way do you see this example involving sparrows meaningful?
- c. The average human head (an average scalp measures approximately 120 square inches or 770 cm²) has about 100,000 hair follicles. Each follicle can grow about 20 individual hairs in a person's lifetime. Average hair loss is around 100 strands a day.
- d. According to God’s Word here, what is the antidote to fear? How does that work?

5. Closing prayer (for what can we be praying, for what can we give thanks?)
