Questions:

1. What are some examples in history where God displays that his people are precious in his sight?
2. Why does it matter that you are precious and honored in God’s sight?
3. What are 3 ways God has shown you that he loves you?

“I thank my God every time I remember you.” Philippians 1:3

Questions:

1. Whom did the Holy Spirit inspire to write these words?
2. To whom did the Apostle Paul address these words? (what is the significance?)
3. Applying these words to your life: Which is easier—to complain about people or to give thanks to God for them? How about people at church? We can learn from Paul’s example here in our attitude toward others, especially brothers and sisters in the faith.
4. In your way of thinking, how can we keep an attitude of thanksgiving in our minds and hearts more?

“Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom.” James 3:13

1. How does God want us to show wisdom?
2. What is meant by one’s “good life?”
3. What is our motivation for living “a good life?”
4. Think of someone you view as wise. Don’t say their name but describe one or more activity they do that you consider wise.
5. According to this verse, what attitude is important? Why?
