



# THREE VERSES BIBLE STUDY

Midweek Zoom Bible Study—May 6, 2026

1. Thank you for participating
2. Some like to use their own Bibles, some like to use a device—either is fine. If you would like to grab your Bible, feel free to take the time now to do so.
3. Prayer to open, there will also be a closing prayer. If anyone wants to include any prayer requests tonight, we will include them as we close in prayer...you can start thinking now if you would like to share any prayer requests at the end.
4. Prayer: “Lord God of the Church, you are awesome in power, greatest in wisdom, and tremendous in love. You are the One who made this world, redeemed this world, and continues to work in this world through your Word and sacraments. Deepen our understanding of your Word and promises through your Holy Spirit. Broaden our understanding of what it means to love others and be brothers and sisters to one another. Strengthen our faith and accomplish your will through us, all to your glory. We dedicate this class to you and come to you in prayer through Jesus. Amen.”

Isaiah 40: 31 **“but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.”**

Questions:

- a. There is a saying in the business world: “No benefit, no value.” What benefit do you see in these verses—secondly, how highly would you value what God gives you in these verses?
- b. How is the renewed strength in the life of a believer displayed? Practically speaking, where might you notice renewed strength from the Lord?
- c. In your mind, why is this descriptive illustration of the eagle so fitting for renewed strength? (they fly 3-4 thousand meters high, fly for hours at a time. They swoop at the fast clip of 200 miles per hour!)

**Psalm 32:8: “I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you and watch over you.”**

Questions:

- a. Compare the first two verbs in this verse. How are they alike? How are they different? Significance?
- b. In what way does God do this for you? (Bible, life-direction, through others sharing wisdom and godly principles)
- c. In your view, what are the implications of the assurance that God will counsel you and watch over you? Take the watch over you first—what does it mean to you that God watches over you? (cf. Ps.1, “watches over the way of the righteous but the way of the wicked will perish.”)

**John 16:33: “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”**

Questions:

- a. Do you appreciate it when people tell you the straight truth like this? What are some “troubles” that people experience in this world?
- b. In what way or ways has Jesus overcome the world?
- c. In what ways does the peace we have in Jesus display itself in everyday life? What are some things that can get in the way? What are some ways we can eliminate some of these obstacles?

1. Closing prayer (for what can we be praying, for what can we give thanks?)
